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## **Pupil Success at Dance World Championships**

Last month, Year 10 pupil Kyarna travelled to Pula, Croatia, with the Deborah Day Theatre School Trust (DDTST) to take part in the International Dance Federation (IDF) World Championships 2018. Here, she recounts her experiences at this prestigious event.

"I practise every Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 4pm to 10pm with my dance school DDTST. We went to the world championships to compete against many different countries and represent team GB. I was very excited and looking forward to the trip.

The different styles of dance I performed in Croatia were: tap, acrobatics, hip hop, modern, song and dance, contemporary, and lyrical. I performed four solos and a

duet with my best friend, as well as many troupe dances with all of my other friends.

I am proud to say that I am a dance world champion, because we came 1st in one of the group dances. Our performance was called 'The Greatest Showman' and in it I was an albino with golden hair.

My favourite dance was my hip hop routine, and I was so happy when I found out I got 10 points for it. I trained for hours a day and worked really hard so I think my hard work paid off. I also got 11 points for my tap, which made me very happy.

I feel very inspired now and I really want to try new styles of dance such as salsa, and work harder in classes, especially tumbling classes.

As well as the competition I also had great fun on the beach and by the pool spending time with my family and friends. The food was OK and I really liked the pizza and McDonalds in Croatia, but I didn't like the accommodation.

I really enjoyed going to the dance world championships and would love to do it again but maybe next time in a different country."

## **Art Club Mosaic Landscapes**

Art Club participants have been busy putting the finishing touches to their beautiful mosaic landscapes.

Pupils looked at Impressionist paintings, focussing on the work of Claude Monet. They looked closely at the way Monet used gestural brush strokes to create vivid colours and textures depicting changes in light. The pupils responded to this by first creating mosaic shapes using small coloured ceramics which they glued to the canvas board. They then added acrylic paint using flat brushes to build layers of colour and contours echoing the shapes of the mosaics with stunning results.











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## **Brandon's Badminton Success**

Year 11 pupil Brandon has recently been offered a place on the England Junior Performance Team following his recent double silver medals at the U19 English National Championship in Boys Singles and Doubles. These silver medals are in addition to his consecutive double bronze medals in the previous two years' competitions.

It has been an exceptional year for Brandon, who is now ranked 4th in England in his age group for Singles and Mixed Doubles, and 2nd for Doubles. In only his first season of international competition he has broken into the world's top 100 for Doubles, being England's 3rd highest ranked Junior Boys Doubles player in the world. His Mixed Doubles is also faring well; he is England's 4th highest ranked boy in the World Junior Rankings after only playing three tournaments, and is hoping to climb higher in the rankings table with more international tournaments this summer.

After this current season, Brandon will need to consider specialising in a particular event or two, a decision which will be made in conjunction with the England coaches. His first England appearance will be in Bulgaria in August; before that, Brandon will be very busy attending several England training camps to prepare, all whilst in the final year of his GCSEs!

## **Normanhurst Sports Report**

**Quad Kids Athletics** Years 2, 5 and 6 all sent teams to compete in the LBWF Quad Kids athletics competition. This event comprises of four boys and four girls who take part in four events, hence the name 'Quad Kids'!

All the children do all four events. The events are standing long jump, howler throw, a sprint and a long run. Our pupils competed to the best of their ability and gave some excellent performances across all the events.

We have not yet had the final results of the competition and as soon as I have them I will share the information with you all. Many thanks to Mrs Karamanlis and Miss Stone who came along to the events and helped.

**Mini tennis** Lily, Queenie, Charlie (Year 6) and Atilla (Year 5) represented Normanhurst in the London Youth Games mini tennis competition held at Ridgeway Park Tennis Hub. They won all their first round matches and gained a place in the borough final, held on Wednesday 6 June. Our pupils played with confidence and there were some excellent rallies. The opposition was very strong and they won two matches but lost three to finish in 4<sup>th</sup> place overall in the borough. Well done - you all played so well!



Netball Years 7 and 8 have been playing in their borough league

matches this term. They have had matches against Heathcote, Holy Family and Walthamstow Academy. They have won 2 and lost 1, and have one more match to play which they need a win to get to the finals in July.

**English Schools Team Tennis** The Year 8 boys tennis team played their last matches in the group stages of the tournament. The match against Davenant was a draw and had to be decided by a sudden death play-off match which unfortunately Normanhurst lost.

**ISA Tennis** In May Hawi (9B), Tino (8T), Patrick (8T), Trinav (8K) and Rafael (8T) took part on the National ISA Tennis Championships. The competition was held at Queenswood School at its tennis academy. This year Hawi played in the U15 age group in both singles and doubles. She played extremely good tennis and made it through the group stages into the knockout matches and all the way to the semi final. It was a close game which Hawi narrowly lost. This put her into the  $3^{rd}/4^{th}$  place playoff match. She finished in fourth place, an excellent improvement on her  $6^{th}$  place finish last year, especially as there were 25 girls entered. In the doubles, Hawi was paired up with a pupil from another school and they combined really well and also finished in  $4^{th}$  place.

In the boys U13 competition Tino, Trinav, Rafael and Patrick all played both singles and doubles. Tino and Trinav made it into the semi-final of

the boy's singles and won the bronze medal. Trinav qualified to play in the plate and was narrowly defeated in the knockout stages.

The standard of tennis was high and everyone played with excellent enthusiasm and commitment. Well done!

## **Normanhurst Sports Report continued**

**ISA Athletics – Bedford** This year pupils from Normanhurst School have been preparing since early March for the annual Independent Schools Association Regional Athletics Competition held at Bedford International Athletics Stadium. PE lessons have focussed on both track and field events. Our pupils use Lee Valley Athletics Centre for their athletics and this is a perfect facility to enable pupils to experience the exact set-up they have to compete in at Bedford. Pupils were selected on merit for all of their events. Pupils are allowed to take part in two events and a relay. The teams are divided into boys and girls from Years 4-7, Years 8/9 and Years 10/11 combined to make teams. They add all the points together to give each school a finishing position. This year our Years 8/9 girls were the overall winners in their age group.

Our pupils won even more gold medals than last year, and seventeen of them will be attending the National ISA Athletics in Birmingham on the Tuesday 19 June. Also many pupils achieved silver and bronze certificates, while others achieved new Personal Bests in their event.

There were so many notable performances. All the pupils gave their best in the distance races and showed a lot of determination in very challenging events such as 800m and 1500m, the relay teams had seamless change overs and outstanding times and the Year 8 girls and



the Year 10 girls and boys teams won their relay races in amazing style to finish the day!
