## Remembrance Assemblies



Year 5 led a Remembrance Day assembly for the whole school at the beginning of November. With a backdrop of poppies, the children read out some poems and letters about the war and Remembrance, and helped the rest of the school understand the meaning behind wearing a poppy.

The Seniors also had a special Remembrance assembly. Mr Hewitt (a member of the maintenance team) spoke to pupils about his mum's contribution to the land army, and he kindly bought her medal and certificate in for the pupils to see. He told a heart-warming true story about the contribution of women and young boys during the war – working on farm land and down mines.

Mr Shields (the school chef) also gave a fascinating insight into rationing during the war. He told pupils about food and cooking on the front line and about rationing at home. He brought examples of the type of food that soldiers and families would have eaten.

At the end of assembly Year 6, 7, 8 and 9 sang a Remembrance song of reflection. All pupils across the school had a 2 minute silence at 11am, and the charity committee have been responsible for selling poppies to pupils and staff.



## Medals from The Great War

Thank you to Kiera in Year 9 who kindly brought in her Great Grandfather's medals from The Great War. Her Grandfather served in the Lancashire Fusiliers. It was a great opportunity for the rest of her class to see the medals, and gave everyone a better understanding of the type of job that those that served in the war were required to do.

## Year 5 Ancient Rome Workshop

Year 5 took part in a fantastic Ancient Rome workshop this term. The class had a visitor from the Epping Forest District Museum who brought in a range of artefacts, some real and some fake. After a brief introduction, each pupil was given a room in a Roman villa where they would 'work' for the rest of the session.



After working out what their room was, they were given the artefacts to explore. It was very tricky trying to work out what the tools and pots were used for, but the class were eager to discuss ideas with each other!



It was a great workshop where everyone learnt a lot about the life and work of Ancient Romans, and how we can still see traces of their life around the UK today.

## Creative Writing Competition

Pupils have been taking part in a Creative Writing competition called 'Mission Catastrophe'. Participants are writing stories that are 100 words long all about a catastrophe which they decide upon, the outcome of it and whether there are any survivors or not. It is an in-House competition where there will be a winner from each year group!

## Year 4 Trip to the British Museum

Year 4 have recently enjoyed an action packed day at the British Museum. In the morning pupils attended a special talk about Ancient Egyptian mummies, where they found out more about the process of mummification and were able to see some CT scan images showing the insides of some of the museum's unopened sarcophaguses.



In the afternoon they then completed a workshop where they learnt more about the Rosette Stone and how it was decoded. The class used coding software to create their own hieroglyphics to represent the letters in their name. They also programmed special LED signs to then display their names.

Year 7 have made some gorgeous needle-felt Christmas decorations.



The idea is to create a 'Keep me' decoration that can be brought out every year to be loved and admired.

## Year 8 Look at Chemical Reactions

The pupils enjoyed setting up their experiments to ensure there would be a fair test. They used precise measurements of mass of fuel, volume of water and temperature change. They compared for the different fuels how the mass of the fuel changed and by how much the water changed temperature.

## Imperial War Museum Trip

Year 9 and 10 History pupils visited the Imperial War Museum, Lambeth this term. Pupils in Year 9 have been exploring different aspects of The Great War – from conditions at home to conditions on the front line.

The classes travelled by tube to Lambeth North and arrived to the enormous tank on the front lawn. Pupils were shown around the WW1 gallery – there were uniforms; letters from soldiers; a mock trench with periscopes and dug outs; examples of rationing, a gallery of weapons and films and accounts of men and women at war.



The pupils were then taken to the learning base where they had a 'FaceTime' message from a historian giving them a brief of what they had to look for in the gallery. They were given mobile recording devices and press passes and made a documentary on different aspects of war. The films will be available for IWM to use and for pupils and parents to view.

## Making Music

This month in Music, pupils have been getting creative with the way that they create sounds. Year 2 had fun creating their own rhythms with 'rhythm sticks', where they had to carefully listen to stay in time with the pulse.



Year 3 created their own tunes on Glockenspiels to demonstrate their ability to hold the beater properly, strike a single key with accuracy and make up a simple melody using only 5 notes.

Year 6 got everyone into the festive spirit by composing their own Christmas melodies which they then performed to the class in pairs. They had to think about what rhymes they used and how they would structure the piece using ostinato rhythms.



## Rock and Roll in the Classroom

Year 9 have had lots of fun learning about different genres of popular music this term, including Rhythm & Blues and Rock & Roll. They've listened to lots of music, composed their own music, played a variety of instruments and even made up their own dances using authentic Rock & Roll steps such as the 'Jive', the 'Shuffle' and the 'Mash Potato'.



## Year 8 Make Bobble Hats

Year 8 pupils have made these super hats using a knitting loom.

The technique requires skill and concentration and the ability to master just the right amount of tension to create a beautiful knitted creation. Their designs displayed both colour contrast and balance and students really enjoyed the experience.

Some of the problems the children could work out themselves, while others required the help of snap cubes.




Year 2 were very happy to work both independently or together, and should be very proud of what they have managed to achieve in Maths.
