## Lower Kindergarten - Shape Monster game on the interactive whiteboard

This month LK have been using the interactive whiteboard in the classroom. Our existing children had played the Shape Monster game before, so it was an opportunity for them to practise their dragging skills with the special pen.



Our new children also enjoyed their first chance to hold and drag the shapes to the correct monster.



It is a fantastic game as it encourages children to persevere when they find it a little tricky. It is wonderful to see their faces when they succeed and really boasts their self-confidence. It also helps strengthen hand and finger muscles used for mark making, as they have to apply pressure to the board in order to drag the shapes.

## Upper Kindergarten - Chinese New Year



All the children in Upper Kindergarten participated in a number of activities to celebrate Chinese New Year. For example, using a fine paint brush they traced over the Chinese characters to write the word 'Hello' in Chinese.

They also engaged in a role play activity pretending to be chefs, waiters, waitresses and customers in our Chinese restaurant. They all created their own lantern using their cutting skills and finally they had the opportunity to sample some Chinese food, such as noodles, rice, water chestnut and prawn crackers.



## Reception Robins



Reception Robins have been learning all about dinosaurs! In a recent lesson they were very excited to find dinosaur fossils in their salt dough!

The children enjoyed this session very much. They very carefully measured out the salt and flour to make the

dough, and had lots of fun getting messy when making it. Once they had their dough ready, they used lots of different dinosaurs to create some footprints.

Dinosaurs came to life in Owls during imaginative play with masks.


The children also worked well together to build dinosaurs using the large skeleton pieces.

## Year 2C Printing



2C have been exploring printing this term. They used their hands and fingers to start with, (but not their faces as some children had suggested!), then the children went on a 'treasure hunt' around the room to find objects they wanted to print.



They came up with some interesting results and we discussed how different parts of the objects create different shapes when printed. The children discovered how less paint on the object actually produced a clearer image, which is the opposite to what they initially thought would happen.

## Year 2S Materials in Science



2S have been investigating different materials in Science. They were exploring different items in the environment and recording which materials they were made out of.



## Year 3 Amateur Dramatics



At this time, Year 3 are very much enjoying drama. In RE, they have used freeze-frames to explore the miracles of Jesus, and this allowed them an opportunity to work collaboratively with their peers and gain valuable insight into how people might interpret stories of faith differently.

Year 3 are also very busy rehearsing for our Year 3 play. Pupils' singing, narration and acting has come a long way from the time when they first began our preparations.

## Year 4 Art Topic





## Year 4 Saatchi Gallery



## Forest School Swimming Gala

A selection of pupils from Years 5 and 6 represented Oaklands at the U11s Forest School Swim Gala on Tuesday 21 January. Against some very strong schools, we witnessed some promising potential from our children, displaying some fantastic, competitive swimming. Jeyda swam magnificently in the 50m Freestyle earning 2<sup>nd</sup> place in her heat with a time of 38.12. Riana showed her all-round ability swimming the butterfly and the individual medley producing some outstanding times. Annabella came agonisingly close to beating the record for 25m freestyle with a time of 17.82 but was pipped to the 1<sup>st</sup> place with a record of under 17secs which shows how strong that race was. Amber demonstrated her potential in the water producing a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish with a respectable 24.48secs in the breaststroke.

As we were down in numbers for the boys team, Alex had to muster up all his energy and fitness levels to swim in the butterfly, breaststroke and the individual medley. He also finished 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in his heats which was a remarkable effort. Cailan came up against some strong swimmers in the backstroke but still finished just behind the front pack showing his competitive spirit. Artie represented the school for the first time in the swimming pool and as swim captain, helped galvanise the swim team, encouraging them all throughout the evenings' races. He swam with great determination, managing to keep up with another strong set of swimmers in the 25m freestyle.

where the children learned how to present data in different ways by illustrating the results in a bar graph. Good work Year 6.






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## French Pen Pals
