Year 10 Study Reversible Reactions

Year 10 are learning about reversible reactions. They have been looking at colour changes of different indicators, and have been able to see how a reaction can go forwards and backwards depending on the concentration of reactants and products.

It was fascinating to see how a solution can turn from white to pink and then back again simply with the addition of acid and alkali at different concentrations.



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Year 7 Compose Music

Year 7 have been studying 'Pictures at an Exhibition' by Musorgsky.



Following this, they then composed their own piece of music depicting a picture by Escher. The class had to choose which picture they were representing from a selection displayed on the board.

Year 8 Look at Photosynthesis

Year 8 enjoy practical lessons in Biology and so this year they tried to observe photosynthesis using an aquatic plant.

The class can see how fast photosynthesis happens in the plant by looking at how fast the oxygen bubbles are released from the stem. Year 8 worked really well to get their experiments set up so efficiently to be able to observe their bubbles.

They also managed to compare the rate of photosynthesis under different conditions. Lauren and Rebecca wanted to prove the gas in the bubbles was actually oxygen so they tested the gas they collected with a glowing splint.

Very impressive investigative work from Year 8.

Year 6 Learn About Electric Circuits

In Science, Year 6 pupils have been learning about electric circuits, components, series circuits, parallel circuits and how to build burglar alarms throughout this term. Pupils have been learning with great enthusiasm and really enjoyed building the circuits, most of them were able to complete the additional challenge activities well.

As part of their homework they were asked to create a poster on circuits and present the information to the rest of the group. Some of the pupils not only completed their posters but also brought in any circuit related pieces they had at home and allowed the rest of the group to share them.

ISA London North Cross Country Competition

Eight of the senior pupils travelled to Bedford for the annual ISA London North Cross Country competition this term. The recent wet weather added extra challenge to the course and they should all be extremely proud of their efforts.

Special mentions must go to Lola, Year 7, as this was her first year at the event and she came a very respectable 35th, Eva, Year 8, who came 25th out of approximately 70 other runners in her age group, and Daisy who ran brilliantly in a very strongly contested Year 9 and 10 competition and came 15th.

GCSE Geography Field Trip
