To raise the children's understanding and awareness about the meaning of Remembrance Day, Year 2 to Year 6 watched and discussed a power point in their classrooms with their teachers. Besides recognising that the peace treaty to end the First World War was signed at 11am on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of the year, the children also realised the importance of why poppies are worn on this special day.

#### **Construction Club**

The children in Construction Club have worked brilliantly in their year group as a team and have taken on their weekly Lego Challenge with enthusiasm. They have been busy building their spatial abilities as they visualise and plan three-dimensional structures including houses, boats, bridges and playgrounds.

At the same time, the blocks of varying sizes and numbers provide hands-on learning for mathematics. With each structure attempted and completed, the children have become more experimental with their designs. Once something works, they've learnt or discovered new solutions to make it better! Back in the classroom, they labelled their sketches and used them to give for ideas for our own 3D models.

#### No Problem for Year 3!

Year 3 have really been enjoying completing some problem solving tasks. They have used computer based applications to challenge each other with their Maths knowledge, and even built fully functioning worlds in three dimensions! Pupils loved completing all the activities available. Who knew that building resilience and making links in learning could be so exciting?!



#### **Year 4C Humanities**



Year 4 have enjoyed looking at Tudor law, crime and punishment. For their class activity, they had to work out what some Tudor outlaws had done wrong then find and match the retrospective punishment that suited. **Super detective work 4C!** 



#### **5G Japanese Art**

Year 5 are studying Japanese Art and have been focusing on Katsushika Hokusai (1760-1849), one of the most successful and well-known landscape painters from nineteenth century Japan. His most famous artworks are within a series of prints entitled, 'Thirty-Six Views of Mount Fuji'. These images depict the mountain from a variety of different locations and in all four seasons. The Year 5's have used this as inspiration for their own interpretation of Mount Fuji in different seasons.





#### Year 6 English



Year 6 have been learning about persuasion in English. They have held a mini debate to discuss which is better, home schooling or traditional schooling. They used all the ideas they had generated to write a balanced argument. They all had interesting points to make, especially reflecting on their own experiences during lock down!



#### Year 5Z PSHE

5Z have made a good start on the next Jigsaw topic for PSHE, 'Celebrating Differences'. Within this, pupils are looking at developing mindfulness through 'Calm Me' time which enables children to 'calm' their minds as well as 'Pause Points' which encourages them to 'Stop and look inside.' The children are gradually developing an awareness of their thoughts and feelings and are starting to use a range of strategies to help them deal with different situations. They are beginning to expand their emotional vocabulary so that they can express themselves more confidently.

5Z are enjoying the Jigsaw Scheme and are working hard to improve their skills within PSHE.

#### **Reception Owls PE**

Reception Owls have enjoyed participating in a number of fun activities during PE this term to practice their hand eye coordination and movement and reaction skills! This has included negotiating ladders, running fast between markers and lots of ball work.









#### **Netball Club**

During Netball Club, the girls have been taking part in a range of skills including speed pass and move as well as honing in on their shooting practice! They will no

mocks in December as a final practice. We wish them lots of luck and success as they finish their 11+ journey.
