### **British Science Week**

This year's British Science Week was a roaring success! From the assemblies and classroom-based activities to the competitions and visits, the children have thoroughly enjoyed celebrating all things Science.

Oaklands had a brilliant week packed with activities. Year 6 pupils visited Bancroft's School to see the Science Fair run by sixth form students, where they learned about a range of topics. A highlight for all were the chemical reactions, such as the rainbow tubes and elephant toothpaste.



Year 3 to 6 rounded off Science Week with a brilliant 'Build and Battle' robotics workshop run by Engineering 4 Kids. After an introduction to the world of robotics, some brave volunteers raced against the visiting engineer to solve a Rubik's cube. The children then worked in teams against the clock to follow a set of instructions to build a programmable robot.

Coopersale Hall were inspired by the theme of Growth and decided to plant their own tomatoes. They can't wait to see the process the tomatoes take to



grow, from sprouts to fruit. Throughout the week, in all KS1 and KS2 Science lessons, pupils presented their own experiments or research. There were practical demonstrations, powerpoints, videos and some amazing display posters.

Normanhurst pupils also had a full week of science, the younger children learnt all about minibeasts, their habitats and the important jobs they do for British farming. Year 3 planted sunflower seeds to watch as they grow and Year 4 learnt all about the life of a giant African snail, they even got to hold some! Lots of the children got to visit the Science Museum, taking in all of the exhibitions and watching fun workshops.



Braeside pupils from Years 5 and 6 investigated reversible and irreversible reactions by conducting 'coke and mentos' experiments, watching how the liquid reacted when the sweet was dropped into the bottle.

Year 6 conducted experiments to answer the question 'Do penguins keep warmer when there are lots of penguins around them?'. They tested lots of different materials to test which would be the best insulation for the 'test' penguin.

What an interesting week for out budding young scientists!

Mark came into talk to the children about his career and how he worked extremely hard to achieve his dreams. Mark spoke to the children about how 'plans don't always go the way you imagine but if you work hard at your goals then that is something you can control and that can set you in a better place'. Pupils and teachers enjoyed getting the chance to meet such an accomplished athlete and hope he visits again soon.

### **Braeside Peri Concerts**

Pupils from Year 1 to 11 performed in two amazing music concerts showing off their talents to family and friends. The audience were impressed by the performances on the piano, guitar, recorder and violin. The pupils enjoy competing against each other and there is always a friendly competitive atmosphere when the schools come together.






### Coopersale Hall's Senior Development

We are delighted to announce that Epping Forest District Council has granted planning consent to develop a newly-purchased adjoining property into classrooms and other facilities for a new senior department at Coopersale Hall School.

There will be a phased introduction of senior pupils to Coopersale Hall over several years, starting with Year 7 in September 2023, with the hope of having a full seniors up to Year 11 from September 2027. The aim is to have around 20 pupils per year group, often taught in smaller classes. Coopersale Hall children will be able to move automatically into the seniors. There will then be external exams for students looking to join the school in the seniors from other local schools. We look forward to this exciting new phase in The Oak-Tree Group's journey.


Pupils put on an excellent display of skills and saw their confidence grow with each match.


Normanhurst have also been raising money and supplies to help those in Ukraine, raising money at a coffee morning and dressing up in blue and yellow to show support and donate.


