The highlight for many was the 'soak daddy' organised by Mr Paine, who also got involved!







#### **Coronation Celebrations**

### **Coopersale Hall Historical Figures Day**

Pupils in Year 5 Graves organised a Historical Figures Day event to achieve their Silver Oak-Tree Challenge award.

The event saw a wide range of figures and characters turn up to school. Notable historical people included Anne Frank, Einstein, Martin Luther-King, Frida Kahlo, Cleopatra, Micky Mantle (Baseball payer) and Roger Banister, who ran the first 4 minute mile.

The pupils were interested to learn about Katherine Switzer, who was the first female to run the Boston Marathon as a numbered entrant. She had registered for the race using her first initial and last name, so her gender on paper didn't raise any suspicion. Although the marathon officials tried to physically remove her, they were unsuccessful and Katherine didn't just make it to the finish line, she made history.

All funds generated by the event were donated were to Shelterbox. Currently over 100 million people around the world have been made homeless by disaster and conflict. Shelterbox is working to change this by providing emergency shelter and tools for families robbed of their home by disaster, helping to transform despair into hope.

Everyone made inspirational choices with their historical figures and we would like to say thank you to our families for their kind donations.

This was a fantastic chance for the children to learn lots of facts about important historical figures and after seeing the success of the day, we hope to make this an annual event.


Well done to all of the children who performed and made it a really wonderful evening.

#### Braeside & Normanhurst **Maths**

Year 7 and Year 8 pupils at Braeside achieved Silver and Bronze certificates in this year's UKMT Junior Maths Challenge held on 26th April.

Over 300,000 students from across the UK sat the Junior Maths Challenge with roughly the top 5% receiving a Gold certificate, the next 10% Silver and the next 25% Bronze. This shows what a huge achievement it was for the pupils who took part.



As part of STEM fortnight, pupils in Early Years to Year 6 at Normanhurst took part in a problem solving experience and had to use their

Mathematical skills to help them find the answers. Pupils enjoyed working collaboratively and using reasoning skills to solve the riddles.



#### Coopersale Hall Record **Breakers**

Records are made to be broken! This is definitely the principle that Mr Barham advocates when competing. The children from Year 3 to Year 6 recently ran the 400 meters with the fastest boy and girl in each year group becoming our first record holders.
